This Change requires Family Housing residents to park/store personal boats/trailers, jet skis and other watercraft, at the Base Marina, Pearl Harbor Marina or other off-base locations. Residents who were previously approved by the Housing Director, to park their boat in family housing are considered "grandfathered" until they PCS. This change is effective 1 June 2004.

4009. BOATS. Effective 1 June 2004, boats, jet skis, other watercraft and their trailers will be parked at the Base Marina, at the Pearl Harbor Marina, or at other off-Base locations. Residents who were previously approved to park their boat in family housing are considered "grandfathered" until they PCS. If previously approved, the boat/trailer must be parked in the respective assigned parking stall or carport area. For safety purposes, the propeller blades must be secured whenever the boat is parked in the housing area. Boats may not be parked in streets or on lawns. All boats and trailers must comply with registration and safety requirements of the State of Hawaii, whether they are in working condition or not.

4010. PUBLIC AND PRIVATE AREAS. The grounds associated with each quarters are considered private areas for the use of the residents and authorized guests. A resident is entitled to the same privacy afforded in any civilian community. Ownership of the housing property by the government does not give residents and their dependents or guests the right to use the property occupied by, or assigned to, other residents. All residents must conduct themselves in such a manner to allow due regard for the rights of others. This includes the use of community sidewalks and walkways, which should be used as such and not as play areas.
