Cyclists take high roads, high speeds

Military and civilian bicyclists from across the island came out in droves Feb. 3 to participate in the 7th Annual Headquarters Battalion Bike-the-Base Grueler, a mountain bike event, and the HQBn. Criterium, a series of racing bike competitions.

Both events were part of the Commanding General's Semper Fit series of athletic events.

The two races presented the opportunity for bicyclists to participate in two very different racing styles.

The Mountain Bike Grueler was a 12-mile road race with a route that began at 8 a.m. and followed a meandering course around the base. Bicyclists pedaled from the starting line at Dewey Square to the flightline, passed over three hills and around the Nu'upia Ponds to end back at Dewey Square.

"They weren't kidding — it really was a grueler. It was a lot of fun, but at some points, I was real lucky to still be on two wheels. It was a challenge, so it was all worthwhile," said bicyclist James Parran.

"I had to pick a path carefully through the ruts (on the tank trail)," said David Stowell, who took first place overall with a time of 42:44. "This is a cool base to race on because it's real scenic and it's mostly a flat course. You get going really fast."

The only thing in common the HQBn. Criterium had with the Mountain Bike Grueler was the fact that it, too, was a fast course. While the Grueler course was determined by distance, the Criterium races were run on a one-mile circuit with a set finish time for each event.

The time trials of the Criterium lasted from 15 to 45 minutes, depending on the category of racing skill for each event.

The first Criterium race kicked off at 11 a.m., and after nine races the final competitor rolled to a stop just after 4:15 p.m.

Some of the Marine and Sailor volunteers from Headquarters Battalion, clad in white T-shirts and camouflage utility trousers, worked as many as ten hours making sure the courses were safe and the riders on track.


"Many of the Marines and Sailors who make up the base units are shift workers. I think it's excellent that they would volunteer the free hours they have off," said 1st Sgt. Kimberly Bush, Headquarters Company first sergeant, HQBn. "For instance, we have three Sailors here from Waterfront Operations who just got off duty and came straight here to help out. To look at them, you couldn't tell they're tired because they're still professional and motivated, and that speaks well of the individuals."

The first sergeant's observations weren't lost on the participants, either.

"I'm very impressed with how many Marines (and Sailors) turned out to help with the race," Stowell said. He added that it made him feel good to see their hard work, knowing that the fees for the races would be going to Marine Corps Community Services and, therefore, given back to the Marines and Sailors.

Along with the help of MCCS, the races were supported by event sponsors Saturn of Honolulu, Gatorade, Pacific Velo, McCully Bicycle, The Bike Shop, and Island Demo.

Though the races varied in nature, the two bicycle events shared a common bond in that the participants said they enjoyed each race, and the physical fitness commitment by the Marines and Sailors on base was once again advanced.

Beware of Scholarship Scams

Officials have warned college-bound students about companies that offer scholarship, grant or financial aid guarantees that are too good to be true.

Many scams use high pressure sales pitches to guarantee scholarships in exchange for an advance fee, according to the Federal Trade Commission.

Often, even if the organization offers a "money back guarantee" to secure a scholarship or grant for a student, conditions of the contract make getting a refund impossible.

Some companies may provide nothing for the students' fees, while others may tell students they have been selected as "finalists" for awards that require a fee. Sometimes, these companies ask for checking account or credit card information to "confirm eligibility" or "hold" the award, then debit the account without permission.





Library puts card catalogs online

Have you ever searched for a book at the base library only to find that they don't have it? Have you wanted something to read but not had the time to browse through the thousands of books the library has to offer?

The MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay and Camp H.M. Smith libraries aim to eliminate the hassle and confusion frequently involved with searching for library books with the internet availability of their card catalog.

The catalog contains the title of every book the library has and makes them searchable by title, author, subject and even genre, making the library much easier to navigate for its patrons, said Jane Olson, a library technician at the Camp Smith library.

The catalog not only contains

information on books here at MCB Hawaii, but also includes that of every base library in the Marine Corps. If the local base library does not have a copy of a book, they can arrange for an inter-library loan from another library by having the book shipped to the local library for the servicemembers enjoyment.

"For people who are willing to wait or who are looking for a rare book, this is wonderful," said Olson. "They can locate almost any book they would need without leaving the comfort of their homes."

The web site also offers library phone numbers, hours of operations and scheduled closures.
