Fest friends may purchase a Fernandez \$15 wristband which grants bearer to unlimited ride access day of purchase.





Young Guns outmanuever Misfits, 18-12

The 3rd Bn, 3rd Marine Regiment "Young Guns" softball team handed the Patrol Squadron 4 "Misfits" an 18-12 loss during their intramural softball game Friday night.

In a game that lasted four innings and produced 30 runs, the tempo of the game was slow.

"The pitching wasn't the greatest tonight, maybe because of the wind," said Shaun P. Mooney, the "Misfits" coach. "Myself and the base coaches could have been more aggressive also."

Although the score remained close until the 4th inning with the "Misfits" down by only one run, the "Young Guns" put up seven runs to start the last inning and the "Misfits" couldn't produce the offense to overcome an eight run deficit.

"We were in the game until the last inning," said Mooney. "We just couldn't get the bats going to make a comeback."

The win brought the "Young Guns" their first back-to-back wins of the season making coach, Paul Gutierrez, a wireman for 3/3, happy his players were able to secure another win despite a 3-8 record and much of the roster sitting out due to injuries.

"We did pretty good considering we've been short-handed," said Gutierrez. "Our hitting has been consistent, but our defense needs to get a lot sharper."

If the "Young Guns" can add a couple more victories to their current string, then they may be looking at a playoff spot later this season.
